## THE EXPERTS

### ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR ANAND DEVA



Associate Professor Deva's clinical practice covers a broad spectrum and includes cosmetic surgery of the face and body, reconstructive facial surgery, elective and acute hand surgery and reconstructive microsurgery. He graduated from the University of Sydney in 1991 with class 1 honours and was awarded the University Medal in Medicine. After completing internship and residency at the Royal Prince Alfred Hospital, he was admitted into advanced training in general surgery in 1994 and completed a Masters of Surgery in 1996. He commenced advanced training in plastic and reconstructive surgery in 1996 and obtained his fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons in 2000. He has received numerous awards and prizes that recognise his contribution to research and teaching.

Topic: Breast augmentation and implants

### DR GAZI HUSSAIN



Dr Hussain is a specialist plastic and reconstructive surgeon with primary interests in cosmetic surgery, facial and breast surgery, microsurgery and skin cancer surgery. He attended the University of New South Wales and after graduating with an MBBS, undertook 10 years of training in surgery which culminated in 1999 with being awarded a Fellowship in Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery from the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons. Dr Hussain then elected to spend a year in Toronto, Canada, to undertake further advanced training in facial paralysis surgery, cosmetic surgery and microsurgery. Dr Hussain is one of Australia's leading experts on facial reanimation surgery and has published papers and presented at international meetings.

Topic: The history of plastic surgery

### DR FREDERICK CLARKE



Dr Clarke studied at the University of Sydney, graduating from a Bachelor of Science with Honours. After completing his plastic surgery training he worked as a plastics consultant at Royal North Shore, Royal Prince Alfred Hospitals and Gosford Hospital before embarking on an extensive international fellowship program. During this time he worked with world renowned reconstructive surgeon Professor Moustapha Hamdi – a pioneer of new techniques in microsurgical reconstruction - and travelled across Europe and the USA gaining detailed expertise in the areas of breast reconstruction and augmentation, body contouring (liposculpture), rhinoplasty and nasal reconstruction, facelifts, oculoplastics (eye surgery) and abdominoplasty (tummy tucks).

Topic: Lumps and bumps – what to look for

### DR QUAN NGO



Dr Ngo is a plastic surgeon who graduated from UNSW medical school in 2001 and obtained the Australasian College of Surgeons Fellowship in 2010. Dr Ngo's areas of interest are head and neck oncology, facial trauma and reconstruction, and microsurgery (including facial reanimation and lymph node transfers). Dr Ngo gained experience in the UK, France and Taiwan in Head & Neck and Microsurgery before returning to take up appointments at Macquarie University Hospital and Liverpool Hospital. He is currently one of the few plastic surgeons in Australia offering microsurgical lymph node transfer surgery, at the Advanced Lymphoedema Assessment Clinic at Macquarie University.

Topic: Cutaneous cancer in the head and neck region
