#### ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR ALICE LEE

Alice Lee is a Gastroenterologist and Hepatologist and Clinical Associate Professor at Macquarie University who following graduation from Sydney University completed a PhD in liver disease. She is currently running the liver services at Concord Hospital and Canterbury Hospital, where she is a senior staff member. In addition to providing general gastroenterology services, she has extensive experience in the care of patients with viral hepatitis and other liver diseases, with interests in application of non-invasive liver fibrosis measures including Fibroscan. She remains active in teaching and clinical research.

Sameer Mihrshahi is an Upper Gastrointestinal Surgeon with special interests in surgery of the liver, gallbladder/biliary tract and pancreas.
