## DR KRISHNA TUMULURI


Dr Tumuluri is an ophthalmologist who subspecialises in eyelid, lacrimal and orbital surgery (oculoplastic surgeon - adults and children). After completing ophthalmology training at Sydney Eye Hospital, he undertook three years of additional training in the subspecialty of oculoplastic surgery. His practice is solely focussed on the management of eyelid, lacrimal and orbital disorders (including thyroid eye disease). He is also an examiner for the Royal Australian and NZ College of Ophthalmologists.

**Topic:** Dr Tumuluri will discuss management of eyelid lesions and malpositions.

## DR HEMA ARVIND

Dr Arvind's clinical interests include glaucoma, cataract and visual electrophysiology. She is an active researcher, publishing several scientific papers and has completed a PhD. Dr Arvind completed her postgraduate training in ophthalmology in India. She then undertook post-specialist training in glaucoma first at Sankara Nethralaya, one of the largest eye hospitals in India, and then at the Sydney Eye Hospital.

**Topic:** Dr Hema Arvind will be discussing the role of the family physician in the early diagnosis and on-going management of glaucoma.



## ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR I-VAN HO

Associate Professor Ho's clinical interests are in medical and surgical diseases of the macular, retina and vitreous, as well as retinal imaging techniques and small incision vitrectomy surgery.

He is a graduate from the University of Sydney and after completing his ophthalmology training at the Sydney Eye Hospital, he undertook two Vitreo-retinal Surgery and Medical Retina Fellowships at Sydney Eye Hospital and then at the University of British Columbia Vancouver, Canada. In 2006, he completed a Macular Disease and Medical Retinal fellowship at the Manhattan Eye, Ear and Throat Hospital and Vitreous Retina Macula in New York. He is currently an Associate Professor of Ophthalmology and Head of Ophthalmic Surgery at the Australian School of Advanced Medicine, Macquarie University and a Clinical Senior Lecturer at the University of Sydney.

**Topic:** Associate Professor I-Van Ho will discuss the top five reasons to refer to a retinal specialist.

## DR TESS HUYNH

Dr Huynh is a fellowship-trained Corneal and External Eye Diseases subspecialist. She graduated from the University of Sydney in 1996. After completing her residency, she commenced RANZCO ophthalmology training at The Royal Victorian Eye and Ear Hospital. Following surgical training, she was granted the Corneal Fellowship for further training with the Corneal Unit at the Centre for Eye Research Australia headed by Professor Hugh Taylor AC. Dr Huynh is an honorary member of The Royal Children's Hospital International for her charitable involvement in the establishment of a screening program for Retinopathy of Prematurity in Vietnam. She has also been heavily involved since 2006, on a voluntary basis, with the Vietnam Vision Project.
