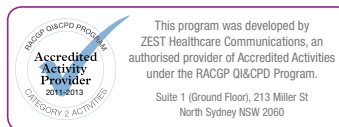

## OPHTHALMOLOGY AT

### MACQUARIE UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL

Offering Sydney a new benchmark in ophthalmic services, Macquarie University Hospital's new eye clinic provides the public with an impressive breadth of eye tests and access to the latest operating theatres. It will also be a hub of ongoing learning for scholars, optometrists and GPs.

Macquarie University Ophthalmology is now the newest private ophthalmic teaching clinic in Australia. The digitally integrated clinic features prominent ophthalmologists drawn from the Sydney area and is located in the Macquarie University Clinic, alongside the hospital and the Australian School of Advanced Medicine (ASAM).

### DR KRISHNA TUMULURI

Dr Tumuluri is an ophthalmologist who subspecialises in eyelid, lacrimal and orbital surgery (oculoplastic surgeon –adults and children). After completing ophthalmology training at Sydney Eye Hospital, he undertook three years of additional training in the subspecialty of oculoplastic surgery. His practice is solely focussed on the management of eyelid, lacrimal and orbital disorders (including thyroid eye disease). He is also an examiner for the Royal Australian and NZ College of Ophthalmologists.

Dr Tumuluri will be discussing topics of interest in relation to eyelid and lacrimal surgery.

### DR NIKHIL KUMAR

Dr Kumar specialises in cataract, refractive and cornea surgery. He graduated in Medicine from the University of Newcastle and completed a Masters in Public Health from the University of New South Wales. He completed his ophthalmology fellowship training at the Sydney Eye Hospital and pursued further fellowship training in cornea and refractive surgery at the University of Toronto, Canada.

He is a clinical lecturer at the Australian School of Advanced Medicine, Macquarie University and at Sydney University.

Dr Nikhil Kumar will be discussing refractive outcomes of cataract surgery, laser vision correction, the management of keratoconus, and corneal transplantation.

### DR JAMES SMITH

Dr Smith has worked in Sydney as a paediatric ophthalmologist for 20 years following his training at Sydney Eye Hospital and the Royal Alexandria Hospital for Children at Camperdown. He holds appointments at the Children's Hospital at Westmead and Royal North Shore where he is head of ophthalmology.

Dr Smith will discuss paediatric ophthalmology for the general practitioner.

### DR ERIC CHAI

Dr Chai is an ophthalmic surgeon with a sub-specialty interest in glaucoma and small incision cataract surgery. A medical graduate of the University of Sydney, he completed his ophthalmic training at the Sydney Eye Hospital and is a Fellow of the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Ophthalmologists. He has completed a Fellowship in Glaucoma at Cheltenham and Gloucester, UK.

Dr Chai will provide an update on glaucoma.
