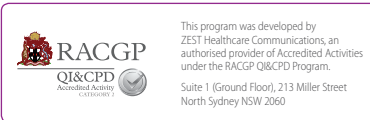

ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR DESMOND BOKOR

Associate Professor Bokor is an Orthopaedic Surgeon with a subspecialty interest in shoulder and elbow surgery. He graduated from Monash University in Melbourne with honours and completed his orthopaedic training in Sydney through the Australian Orthopaedic Association training program.

Following this, he completed fellowships in sports medicine/knee surgery in Sydney and then spent time at the University of Western Ontario, Canada, as a fellow training in shoulder surgery. He has a Master of Higher Education (Medical) from Macquarie University.

Associate Professor Bokor is a founding member of the Shoulder and Elbow Society of Australia and a member of the American Shoulder and Elbow Surgeons Society, as well as of the Australian Orthopaedic Association, the Australian Medical Association and Sports Medicine Australia. He is also currently Associate Professor and Chair of Orthopaedics and Musculoskeletal Medicine at the Australian School of Advanced Medicine and of Macquarie University Hospital Orthopaedics.

ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR JAMES SULLIVAN

Associate Professor James Sullivan is an Orthopaedic Surgeon with subspecialty interests in hip and knee surgery and joint replacement. He is an Associate Professor and Head of Arthroplasty at the Australian School of Advanced Medicine, Macquarie University.

Associate Professor Sullivan graduated from the University of Sydney with honours in 1981, and received his Fellowship of the Australasian College of Surgeons in Orthopaedics in 1989. Following this, he completed a Fellowship in Arthritis and Reconstructive Surgery at Harvard University, and a Master of Higher Education (Medical Education) at Macquarie University.

Associate Professor Sullivan is a member of the Australian Medical Association, Australian Orthopaedic Association and Arthroplasty Society of Australia. He has been AOA State Chair and Federal Board member. He is a Hearing Member of the Medical Council of NSW and has been a member of the Federal Government MRI Advisory Board and the Board of the National Institute for Clinical Studies.

DR SIMON COFFEY

Dr Simon Coffey is an Orthopaedic Surgeon and Clinical Lecturer at the Australian School of Advanced Medicine, Macquarie University. He has a particular interest in primary and revision hip and knee replacement as well as in lower limb reconstruction and sports injuries.

In specialist orthopaedic practice since 1997, Dr Coffey has also held senior clinical administrative roles as Head of Department and AOA State Chair. He continues to be actively involved in student and registrar training, and is a regularly invited lecturer at courses in joint replacement in Australia and internationally.

Dr Coffey is a Fellow of the Australian Orthopaedic Association, the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons, the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons, the Australian Society of Orthopaedic Surgeons and the Australian Medical Association.

DR KALMAN PIPER

Dr Kalman Piper is an Australian-trained Orthopaedic Surgeon with a special interest in Shoulder Surgery. After graduating from the University of Queensland, he moved to Sydney to complete his orthopaedic training with the Australian Orthopaedic Association. He then performed one year of sub-specialist training in Advanced Shoulder Surgery in France with Dr Laurent Lafosse, a world leader in shoulder surgery. In France, Dr Piper has learnt new and innovative techniques that he has introduced into Australia.

Dr Piper has contributed to many research articles in shoulder surgery, has presented at international meetings, and has co-authored a book chapter on Minimally Invasive Shoulder Replacement. He has a strong interest in clinical research and continues to contribute to orthopaedic science through Macquarie University. He has an academic appointment at the university and trains international Orthopaedic Surgeons in shoulder surgery.

Dr Piper aims to provide patients with up to date treatment options for their condition, so that they can make informed decisions regarding their care.

DR VERA KINZEL

Dr Vera Kinzel is an Orthopaedic Surgeon with a special interest in knee, shoulder and trauma surgery for the adult and paediatric population. Dr Kinzel graduated from the prestigious medical school of Münster in Germany where she also obtained a PhD in medicine.

Dr Kinzel completed her surgical training at the Royal College of Surgeons of England and the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland. She then attended the Australasian College of Surgeons Advanced Training Program in Orthopaedic Surgery. After receiving her Fellowship, Dr Kinzel completed an additional one-year Fellowship at the North Sydney Orthopaedics and Sports Medicine Center and at the Sydney Orthopaedic Research Institute. She then completed a further Fellowship in shoulder surgery in Hamilton, New Zealand.

Dr Kinzel has a strong interest in research and development, and has published numerous papers in knee, trauma and upper limb surgery. Her work has been presented at international and national meetings.
