

ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR RAMI SORIAL



Associate Professor Rami Sorial graduated from Sydney University medical school with first class honours and completed training with the Australian Orthopaedic Association in 1993. He undertook two further years of subspecialty training in hip and knee reconstructive surgery including fellowships in Phoenix, Arizona and at

the Brigham and Women's Hospital and Harvard University in Boston. After working in London for 6 months he returned to a senior lecturer post at the Royal North Shore Hospital in 1996. He was appointed to the Nepean Hospital in 1997 and continues to provide a specialty practice in both primary and complex revision joint reconstruction, knee and hip replacement, arthroscopic knee surgery and ligament reconstruction as well as a trauma service for a busy regional trauma centre. He is currently Head of Department at Nepean Hospital in Penrith. Associate Professor Sorial served 10 years on the AOA training committee with 4 years as chairman of the NSW training committee and ongoing commitment to registrar training and education. In 2010 he commenced specialty practice at Macquarie University Hospital as a senior scholar and in 2013 was appointed Adjunct Associate Professor of surgery for the Nepean clinical school, Sydney University. Associate Professor Sorial has lectured both nationally and internationally and has participated in demonstration surgeries locally and internationally. He was awarded a visiting professorship through Sichuan University for his work in West China Hospital, Chengdu and is currently the President of the Asia Pacific Arthroplasty Society. He is a Fellow of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons.

ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR HABER



Associate Professor Haber is a specialist orthopaedic surgeon focused on advanced shoulder arthroscopy techniques. He is one of the leading arthroscopic shoulder specialists in Australia. Since 2000, Associate Professor Haber has performed more than 2,000 shoulder arthroscopies and pioneered a modified

technique for arthroscopic rotator cuff repair. The technique is now widely used in Europe, England and in the US.

His ongoing research includes rigorous post-operative evaluations, looking at ways to optimise rehabilitation. He has presented at major international orthopaedic conferences in both Australia and abroad, winning best paper awards and international recognition. He teaches advanced arthroscopic shoulder techniques to surgeons in Australia, Asia and Europe, and frequently welcomes domestic and international visitors to his operating theatres.

Dr Gursel graduated from the University of New South Wales with honours in 1992 and spent his junior years at Concord Repatriation Hospital. He commenced his AOA accredited orthopaedic training with the Sydney Northside Scheme and obtained his Orthopaedic Fellowship (FRACS) in 2001. This was followed by arthroplasty fellowships in the UK and Australia.
