Dr Fiona Foo specialises in interventional cardiology and general adult cardiology.

She graduated from the University of Western Australia with honours, and completed her Advanced Cardiology Training in Fremantle Hospital (WA). She then undertook Interventional Cardiology Fellowships in the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute, in Edmonton, Canada; and

the Golden Jubilee National Hospital in Glasgow, Scotland.

Dr Foo's interests include coronary interventions via the radial approach, use of fractional flow reserve, acute coronary syndromes, cardiac risks of non-cardiac surgery following coronary revascularisation, and ischaemic heart disease in women.

Fiona is active in helping provide coronary interventional service and training in developing countries such as in Nepal and Fiji.

Dr Aggarwal holds a Fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians and is a member of the Cardiac Society of Australia and New Zealand. He has Level 2 accreditation with the Society of Cardiovascular CT and is currently involved in clinical research in this rapidly expanding subspecialty at the Prince of Wales Hospital as a postgraduate research fellow.
