### **ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR ALICE LEE** GASTROENTEROLOGIST AND HEPATOLOGIST

Associate Professor Lee is a gastroenterologist and hepatologist, clinical associate professor at Macquarie University and currently leads the liver services at Concord and Canterbury Hospitals, where she is a senior staff member. A graduate from the University of Sydney, Associate Professor Lee completed a PhD in liver disease (Sydney University) and remains active in teaching and clinical research. In addition to providing general gastroenterology services, she has extensive experience in viral hepatitis, and the clinical application of non-invasive liver fibrosis measures including fibroscan.

### **DR KEVIN HO-SHON** RADIOLOGIST

Dr Ho-Shon graduated from Medicine at the University of Sydney in 1994 and with a Bachelor of Science with honours in Computer Science in 1995. He was the PET registrar in 1998 and in 1999 he obtained a Masters of Science with research in physiological modelling using Positron Emission Tomography. After radiology training at the Royal Prince Alfred, he continued his research at the School of Mathematics and Statistics at the University of Sydney. He is currently a Staff Specialist at RPAH in interventional and diagnostic radiology and is a Partner in Specialist Magnetic Resonance Imaging.

### **DR PIROOZ POURSOLTAN** MEDICAL ONCOLOGIST

Dr Poursoltan is a medical oncologist with a special interest in gastro-intestinal, lung and breast cancers. He worked at Royal North Shore Hospital and has been practising at Macquarie University Hospital since 2011. Dr Poursoltan holds a Master of Science in Medicine from The University of Sydney. He has also taken extra training in genetics with interest in molecular biology of lung cancer, during which he worked on the genes potentially involved in the pathogenesis of lung cancer. Dr Poursoltan has worked at the Garvan Institute and University of Sydney.

### **DR SAMEER MIHRSHAH** GASTROENTEROLOGIST

Dr Mirhshahi is an upper gastrointestinal surgeon with special interests in surgery of the liver, gallbladder/biliary tract and pancreas. He completed surgical training in Newcastle and Sydney and then undertook upper GI fellowships in Sydney and Glasgow. For the following four years, Dr Mirhshahi had a consultant practice in the UK (Surrey and Bristol). He returned to Sydney in mid-2011 where he commenced work at Macquarie University Hospital.

### **ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR RUPERT LEONG** GASTROENTEROLOGIST

Associate Professor Leong is a consultant gastroenterologist and associate professor of medicine at the University of New South Wales and Macquarie University. He is the current director of endoscopy and senior staff specialist at Concord Hospital, and former director of gastroenterology at Bankstown Hospital, where he is currently a staff specialist. Associate Professor Leong trained in Perth with further training completed in Hong Kong. His expertise includes interventional endoscopy and management of inflammatory bowel disease. He publishes widely, fosters novel research, serves to educate (at all levels) and is a section editor for the Journal of Gastroenterology and Hepatology.

### **DR CHRISTOPHER ROGAN** RADIOLOGIST

Dr Rogan obtained First Class Honours, Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery, Bachelor of Medical Science from the University of New South Wales, Sydney and graduated in 2002. After completing basic surgical training he trained in radiology at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital. He was the Interventional Radiology Fellow for Imperial College Trust at Hammersmith, Charing Cross and St Mary's Hospitals in London. On returning to Australia he took up his current position as Staff Specialist at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital, where he runs the vascular surgery and cardiothoracic surgery multidisciplinary team meetings and he is an active member of the Interventional Radiology Society of Australasia.
