THE EXPERTS

DR DAVID WECHSLER

Dr Wechsler graduated from the University of Sydney with honours in medicine in 1997, trained as a general doctor at Concord Hospital and then as an ophthalmologist at Sydney Eye Hospital and Liverpool Hospital. In 2006-2007 he undertook further training overseas in the field of glaucoma at Manchester Royal Eye Hospital and Calderdale/Huddersfield in the UK. He is actively involved in teaching the next generation of ophthalmologists. He has published articles and reviews articles for scientific papers, is involved in clinical research, attends and presents at local and international scientific meetings. Dr Wechsler performs and teaches cataract and glaucoma surgery, and is one of the few specialists in NSW to perform tube-shunt surgery for severe glaucoma. He is a clinical lecturer at the School of Advanced Medicine, Macquarie University, and he also consults at the Macquarie University Eye Clinic.

DR KRISHNA TUMULURI

Dr Tumuluri is an ophthalmologist who subspecialises in eyelid, lacrimal and orbital surgery (oculoplastic surgeon - adults and children). After completing ophthalmology training at Sydney Eye Hospital, he undertook three years of additional training in the subspecialty of oculoplastic surgery. His practice is solely focussed on the management of eyelid, lacrimal and orbital disorders (including thyroid eye disease). He is also an examiner for the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Ophthalmologists.

DR KIRAN SINDHU

Dr Sindhu graduated from the University of Tasmania in 1984 and completed his ophthalmology training in 1992. Dr Sindhu is a Fellow of the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Ophthalmologists. His main surgical interests are with cataract and glaucoma patients, with additional interests in paediatric ophthalmology. Dr Sindhu commenced private practice in Sydney in 2000, after several years in Tasmania, and has been involved extensively in ophthalmology registrar training since 1993.

Topic: Watery Eyes and Strabismus



DR ROHAN MERANI

Dr Merani completed his undergraduate medical degree at the University of Sydney, graduating with honours. This was followed by a Master of Medicine degree. He undertook his ophthalmology training at Sydney Eye Hospital, followed by a subspecialty fellowship in medical retina with Professor Paul Mitchell at Westmead Hospital. He is a clinical associate lecturer at the University of Sydney in the discipline of clinical ophthalmology and eye health.

Dr Merani has presented research papers at scientific meetings, published papers in peer-reviewed journals, is a reviewer for scientific journals and has been a treating investigator in clinical trials for macular degeneration and diabetic retinopathy. He regularly attends international meetings to keep up to date with developments in medical retina. His areas of expertise include age-related macular degeneration, diabetic retinopathy, retinal vascular diseases and other macular disorders.
